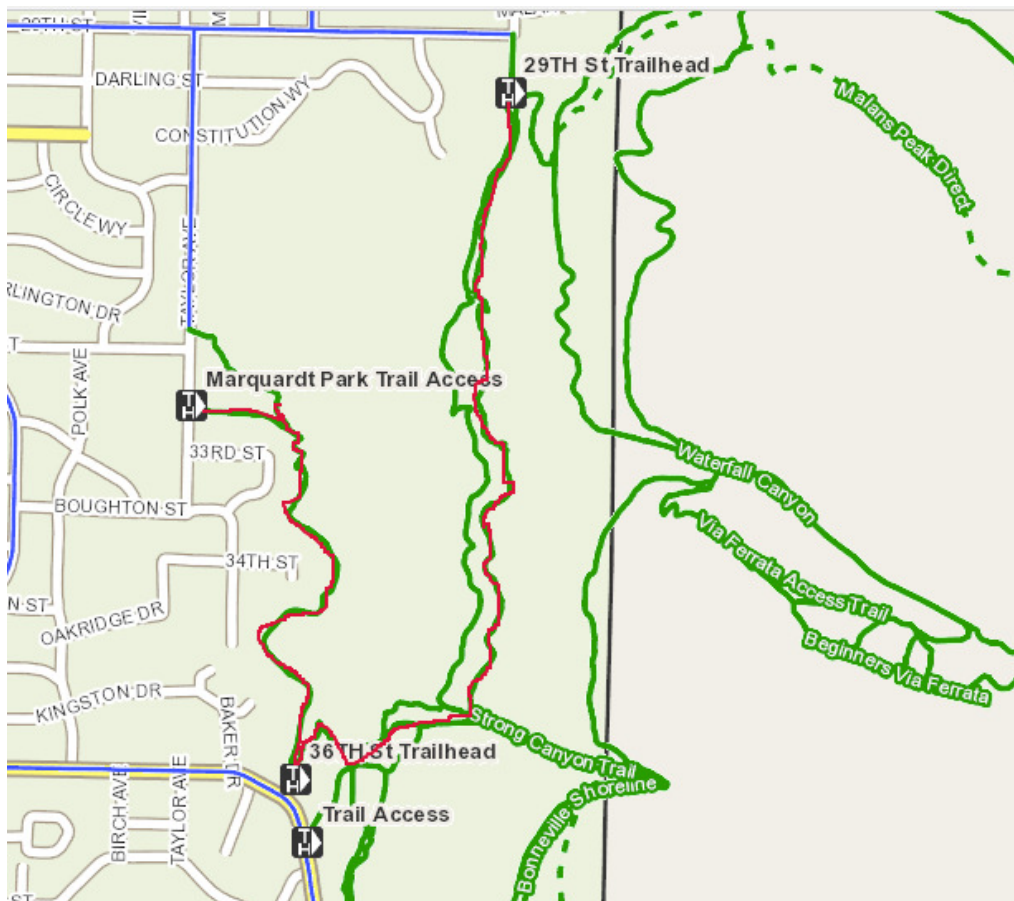
Suggested 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Route

Trail route is shown in **RED**.

## 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Route

Start: 29<sup>nd</sup> Street Trailhead

End: Marquardt/Mt. Ogden Park



**Route:** Starting at 29<sup>th</sup> Street Trailhead, we will head south and follow above the golf course. The route passes across Strong Canyon. The trail will reach one of the two 36<sup>th</sup> Street Trailheads and head north as it follows around the Mt. Ogden Golf Course. The trail will drop into the Marquardt Park. From there, hikers can walk through the Mt. Ogden Park and up 29<sup>th</sup> Street back to the Trailhead. *There will be shuttle available from Marquardt Park to 29<sup>th</sup> Street Trailhead, if needed.*

**Elevation:** Heading South is fairly level; going West down Strong Canyon descends 300 feet; and heading North is mostly level again.

**Trail Surface:** Mostly dirt; gravel in some areas; grassy at the Marquardt and Mt. Ogden Parks; asphalt and concrete heading back to the 29<sup>th</sup> Street Trail Head.

## Extra Route Information:

*Bonneville Shoreline Trail (BST):* the Weber County section of the BST is part of a 280 mile route that stretches from the Idaho/Utah border to Santaquin, UT and follows along the shoreline of the ancient Lake Bonneville. 21 miles of the BST have been constructed in Weber County and is open to all non-motorized recreation. This trail is accessible from over 14 different trailheads from Pleasant View to South Ogden.

*Waterfall Canyon:* a 1.2 mile hike into the canyon will lead hikers to a beautiful 200-foot waterfall. The land on each side of the trail is private property, but the trail has been used for over 150 years.

*Marquardt Park:* offers large grassy areas and a shady walking trail. A playground is available with nearby restroom facilities and water. A winding stream and lots of treed picnic space makes this park unique. It offers a large group picnic area, as well as individual picnic spots. It also has a parking lot.
